


Empowering Women Through Skills Training

Caritas Mongolia, in partnership with Secours Catholique, came up with a 2-year plan (2012 and 2013) in view of empowering beneficiaries with skills to allow them become self-supporting persons. On the other hand, a series of training and capacity building were planned to sensitize beneficiaries on issues such as exploitation, domestic violence and human trafficking. This second component was to include a good number of schools and children care centers. Caritas Mongolia opted for women headed households, battered and unemployed women, coming from the Ger areas of Songino Khairkhan District, sub-district of Bayankhoshuu. To this category, young students and academic staffs were to be added through awareness workshops.



As a consequence of active and full attendance, there were 73 graduates from 120 hour sewing or handicrafts training, who received recognized certificates from Caritas Mongolia. Thus, opening the door either to employment or own small income generating activities. 28 beneficiaries attended other additional trainings such as cooking classes and micro business trainings.



Cooperation

STC was invited to an international exhibition, Future Mongolia, organized by German companies. A great opportunity not only for STC as such but for beneficiaries as it turned out to be a mirror and an opportunity to "sell" the skills and get some orders. Thanks to the International Women Association of Mongolia (IWAM), STC is regularly allowed to exhibit its products at their monthly gatherings. STC, slowly but surely, is making its way into the society, thus important visitors were welcome, among them: Representatives from the German Embassy, French Embassy, and some individual visitors.

STC towards the future




As a whole, STC has made a certain improvement in its services: quality of products, quality of its training programs and of course its visibility. This makes us believe strongly in the need to continue the program in the future. As the 2-year plan comes to an end, Caritas Mongolia deemed it necessary to end this period with a good evaluation in order to foresee and plan for the future. Thus, 3 persons were involved in this process of evaluation: Mr. Frank de Caires, Director of "On-Change Ltd, Mrs. P. Tumenkhishig and V. Bayarjargal, both from the Mongolian National Technical University and Ms. Katie Niemeyer, an American working in Mongolia. The evaluations included personal visits at STC, checking of curriculum, training environment and equipment, meeting with trainers, current and former trainees. The evaluations will be the focal point for 2014 as we continue the journey of effectiveness.

Voluntary Return and Social Reintegration Program

2013 the list of CM partners was enriched by a new member, namely Refugee Action. All combined (from Austria, Belgium, The Netherlands and United Kingdom), 98 clients were welcomed back by Caritas Mongolia.

Mr. M returned from The Netherlands with her daughter, he planned to start agricultural activities and used the support of reintegration fund for buying a tractor.









2013 has seen a good number of partners visiting Mongolia to touch the reality of the ongoing program. Thus in October we were happy to welcome Government Officials from the Netherlands (Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Justice). Their visit included, an official meeting was held with Representatives of Caritas Mongolia, Ms. J. Nasanjargal (Program Manager), Cathy Bolortsetseg, Giimaa Erdene (both Project Officers). The visit was also an opportunity to visit some of the returnees who came from are supported by the Government of the Netherlands.



The project also published some brochures and IEC materials containing specific service and information of each partner organizations.

Innovative Farming Approaches and Food Security in Mongolia

2013 was the end year of Caritas Mongolia's first ever EU funded project on Food Security and Innovative Farming Approaches in Mongolia, implemented in cooperation with SCCF. Through this project Caritas Mongolia gained a tremendous experience and recognition in the eyes of many different stake holders. Thanks to this project today Caritas Mongolia is one of the well known organizations in Mongolia when it comes agriculture.

Through IFAM project Caritas Mongolia reached out to 370 most vulnerable households out of which 70% of them were female headed households. In total, 222 Passive Solar Green Houses, 39 Trench Green Houses were constructed and 65 Bio-climatic household cellars were improved.



From 2010-2013, CM organized a total of 269 trainings under 14 different topics and over 3000 people were capacitated. Next to this, 30 construction masons and 20 agro-advisors were trained and awarded with certificates.

Community groups were established, respectively 25 in Ulaanbaatar and 5 in Gobi-Altai. Today the Gobi-Altai beneficiaries are officially registered as a cooperative under the name of "ENERGIIN ORGIL".





The project closed officially on November 30, a closing ceremony was organized with representatives of project partners, highlighting the achievements and learnt-lessons throughout the project cycle.

In partnership with Caritas Czech Republic, under "Supporting a greener and more energy efficient construction industry in Mongolia" project, Caritas Mongolia is coordinating trainings in technical and vocational schools and disseminating the green construction practices.

Supporting a Greener and More Energy Efficient Construction Industry in

Mongolia"

In 2013 initial survey was conducted among all the technical and vocational schools and colleges in Ulaanbaatar, Erdenet and Darkhan cities.

Based on the survey, 10 schools in Ulaanbaatar, 5 in Erdenet and 4 in Darkhan were selected for the project. In October, the Swedish Environmental Research Institute helped in developing a curriculum for Vocational and technical schools, which needs to be officially approved by the Ministry of Labour.

In December, CM managed to provide the very first training on green construction at the Institute of Engineering and Technology.

In 2014 CM plans to establish collaboration with the remaining TVETs and organize trainings accordingly.


